Nursery

Our youngest pupils have settled into Holyhead really well, making new griends and learning how to learn and play together. Speaking and listening skills have been developed through many engaging activities both indoors and outdoors, including looking after our school chickens, building cardboard castles, and making potions in our mud kitchen.

<u>Reception</u>

Early reading, writing and number skills have been a key focus in our Reception class this term. Every time I have visited them, they have been working hard with their teachers to master these early skills through exciting text such as Owl babies, Elmer and exploring the incredible changes Autumn brings. They engage amazingly well in the learning activities and have developed confidence during their Christmas performances.

Starling each day, developing a secure phonic understanding has supported your year I children,



becoming more independent readers. I'm immensely proud of the progress they have made, and it is a joy to watch them read with their peers with more confidence. Year I have also gained a good knowledge of toys from the past and developed their musical skills during their current E3L topic. Going to watch Tales from Acorn Wood at the Theater this week was a lovely way to end this term of learning! They all represented Holyhead extremely well and I hope

they enjoyed it as much as our staff have.

The Day the Crayons Quit has been a stimulus of both our writing and reading in our year 2 class, and they have all produced some amazing pieces of writing! Developing fluency in their reading has been a key focus and the success of this can been seen across the whole curriculum. Thank you for the support in continuing this skill at home, during your home reading and phonics They had learnt so much about patterns found in nature, covering lots of subjects including Art,

Music, and Mathematics. The work completed in their exercise books really showcase all their knowledge, which Mrs Burnett looks forward to sharing with you during our next parents' evening

<u>Year 3</u>

Going back in time to the stone age has sparked the imagination of all our year 3 pupils. They have explored early ways of communication, through cave drawings and even made some of their own examples in their class cave. Stepping into the shoes of a stone age boy they have developed their writing skills by creating a diary entry.

They have also been developing their orienteering skills by navigating themselves around the school grounds. Their skills have not stopped there as they have all grown in confidence in drama

and performance during their weekly HEN session. Mrs Meadows is always boosting about their talents and impeccable behavior in the staffroom

<u>Year 4</u>

Discovering the different properties of solids, liquids and gases has been a key feature in our year 4 class with all our children successfully making their own candles. Our Merlin topic has stimulated so much learning this half term, including cooking an apple pie with our families during a medieval banquet and reading our focus text about historical legends has produced some amazing



pieces of writing and medieval Castle designs fit for a king and queen.
